Letter from the Editor—Fred Richards



But regionals offer more point opportunities and more training. Nationals provide even more opportunities.

Four years ago I set out to get my red hat (100 points plus a Mark of Excellence Car). I achieved that last year in Hampton VA. I complained a LOT about how hard it is to get judging opportunities, but now I finally understand the responsibilities of the Team Leaders.

You have to prove that first you will show up and work the whole day. Working with C4s and C5s we often have 5 or more cars and the means judging all day. The leads also want to know that you can describe to the owner why you scored the way you did. It is a tough responsibility that the leaders take on.



All though the museum had a few restations, most of the vehicles where restrorods. The museum is working on a 30,000 square foot addition that will hold several themed spaces to display more vehicles.


After the tour we went to the Skillet near by for some great home cooking and shared time together.
